### Youth Perinatal Residential SUD In Rescue, CA



#### Population Served:

Pregnant Native American Youth



#### Purpose:

This non-medical residential facility will serve up to 16 pregnant youths and their children who are at risk of homelessness, may have substance use disorders (SUD), or are escaping from violent environments. This facility is the last step before they transition to permanent housing.

#### Location & Design:

The 18.9-acre facility at 2761 Sands Road in Rescue offers a serene, rural setting for healing and growth. It features a single-story building with 16 bedrooms.

### Adult Residential Facility (ARF) for Men – 30 Beds, Shingle Springs, CA



#### Population Served:

Native American men aged 18-59 or those over 60

#### Location & Design:

966 Best Life Lane in Shingle Springs features a home design with 15 bedrooms, providing 30 semi-private beds focused on person-centered care in the least restrictive environment.

#### Purpose:

Designed for individuals with disabilities, this facility provides daily activity support in a home setting. The ARF will prioritize the admission of Native veterans



### Wellness Center Shingle Springs, CA



#### Population Served:

Up to 250 Native Americans



#### Purpose:

The Wellness Center promotes health and sobriety among Native Americans through traditional healing practices like equine therapy, horticultural therapy, and counseling, integrating cultural values into its structured day program.

#### Location & Design:

Located at 3655 North Shingle Road, Shingle Springs, near Highway 50, this 19.2-acre center features a barn-like structure that blends with its natural surroundings. It's designed for therapeutic activities such as equine and horticultural therapy.

### Adult Residential Facility (ARF) for Women – 30 Beds, Rescue CA



#### Population Served:

Native American women aged 18-59 or over 60

#### Location & Design:

Located at 3480 Deer Valley Court in Rescue, this 10-acre facility offers a tranquil environment for healing and personal development. It features a residential-style design with 15 bedrooms, accommodating up to 30 residents in semi-private rooms.

#### Purpose:

Person-centered assisted living for women aged 18-59 and over 60 with disabilities, emphasizing safety, empowerment, and growth. The ARF will prioritize those at risk of becoming victims of the Murdered Indigenous Women (MMIW) crisis. This residential facility provides assistance with daily living activities such as eating, bathing, dressing, mobility, toileting, and continence, but does not provide the intensive medical care available in nursing homes or hospitals.
